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About DLE

1. English 1 courses offering by Department Language Education

LEVEL Remedial:

English Foundation (EF)

English Foundation builds on the basic foundation through the integration of speaking, listening, reading, and writing.

LEVEL 1:

English Communication (EC)

English Communication develops all four language skills with a particular focus on lecture listening and paragraph writing. Listening develops students' note-taking skills for use with academic lectures. Writing focuses on academic paragraphs and speaking develops students' participation in group discussions and formal presentations. Reading exposes students to a range of academic texts while academic vocabulary is also developed with the Academic Word List.

LEVEL 2:

English Reading and Composition (ERC)

Students will develop academic reading skills and will be prepared to be able to engage in higher

order discussions in English. Students will also be able to produce a summary paragraphs in English which demonstrate solid structure and organization and which, from a grammatical standpoint, are reasonably well-written. Students will study and practice specific grammar topics related to second language essay writing and develop introductory, body, and concluding paragraphs

LEVEL 3:

English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

The purpose of EAP courses is to build a bridge between the general academic English language competencies taught in the DLE and the academic English language competencies required by students in their major classes (that are taught in English). EAP courses are designed in order to prepare students with the specific language competencies required in order for them to perform well in their major courses while they are students at HGU. As a result, under the umbrella of “EAP”, there will be various discipline specific versions of the course taught with the aim of tailoring different EAP courses to the specific and various needs of the different disciplines offered at HGU.

2. English Tutoring Program

The DLE will host a English tutoring program. This English tutoring program will allow foreign students who are proficient at English to receive social service credit for serving as English tutors for EF and EC students.

DLE English tutoring program will be 1:1 class and for weekly social service, at least 2 hours on each visit is required. Refer to the posting on Hisnet.

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
